Sports Premium

Yeoman Park Academy appreciates the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

We are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive a minimum of 2 hours of PE per week, delivered by well-trained and enthusiastic teachers. The Sport Premium funding is allowing us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and a new curriculum based on developing children's physical skills.

Regular staff training opportunities are provided for teachers and teaching assistants (TAs) to keep them abreast of new initiatives.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years to provide new and substantial primary and special school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary and special schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The money can **only** be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

What is the Sugar Tax?

In the 2016 Budget, Chancellor George Osborne announced that revenue from the soft drinks industry levy will be used to double the primary school PE and sport premium from £160 million per year to £320 million per year from September 2017, to help schools support healthier, more active lifestyles. This additional funding will enable primary schools to make further improvements to the quality and breadth of PE and sport they offer. This means that the sports grant has been doubled this year to £1000 per eligible student.

Purpose

- To deliver the Dance strand of the Physical Education Curriculum.

- To increase physical confidence and body awareness, including proprioception
- To develop foundation physical skills from base point for each child: co-ordination, agility, core strength, balance, memory, sequencing

Evaluation

- Student feedback indicates that they enjoy these sessions
- It is felt that it would be beneficial for primary to undertake sessions during the Autumn term such that activities could be incorporated in to a Christmas production.

Occupational Therapy	£2145	To deliver PE circuits to all pupils in academy
Purpose		

- To deliver 1/2 a day of Sensory Circuits for half of each term Primary (1st half Autumn Term), Secondary (2nd half Spring Term) and Upper + Base (2nd half Summer Term)
- To ensure staff develop a greater understanding of the sensory needs of pupils
- Identify activities that have a calming, alerting and organising effect on the children to help enhance engagement within PE
- Develop the children's sensory motor skills to engage in PE
- Train staff to be confident to deliver a sensory motor PE session
- Develop sensory motor strategies that can be used with the children across the academy environment
- To improve pupils fitness and well being

Evaluation:

- Student feedback indicates that they enjoy these sessions
- All classes report that OT input has a positive impact on students being ready to learn.
- Therapy records indicate that all students have benefitted from these session
