This half term we are busy learning about travelling and journeys as part of our whole academy theme: 'Transport and journeys'. We are finding out the answer to our big question 'how do we get there?'

Each week we have been enjoying getting on our magic flying carpet and simulating travelling to different countries such as Thailand, Mexico and China, we made it just in time to celebrate and experience Chinese New Year! We have enjoyed exploring and experiencing different cultures and traditions through food, music, materials and clothing associated with each country. 
Also this term Bee's class have been experimenting with sink or float objects, we have all thoroughly enjoyed this.

Hello to all of our parents/Carers.

This half term we are concluding our transport topic. After looking at the development of the steam powered vehicle and Richard Trevithick's Christmas disaster, and following the development of railway travel we are now following the development of the automobile through the decades. This half term we also have our topic visit to the National Railway Museum. I am sure the children will be amazed at the size and complexity of these railway engines, including Mallard, The Flying Scotsman and the Bullet train.

Our second topic has had us learning about rivers and canals. We have visited the river Maun and the river Trent and are now focusing on canals. Hopefully we will get a visit to a canal before the Easter break.

Each week continue to work on our English and maths and our focus for these is to revisit the correct way to form our letters, to attempt independent writing, or develop our writing with clear sentences, and, in maths, to improve our skills in telling the time and using metric measure.

After helping our community with litter picking work we are now focusing on helping the birds with bird feeders and filling pine cone with fat and seed. This should help the birds over the last difficult part of the winter. We are also continuing our project to make a wild flower patch, which will help the bird throughout the year and bring a patch of colour to the school playground.

We are also looking forward to our new permanent member of Ants class. Declan has been slowly moving form another class into ours. By the end of this term he will be a permanent member of Ants class.





We have had a very busy half term getting to know our new teacher and learning lots of new things. We have learned the names of the planets in the Solar System using 'My Very Evil Monster Just Scares Us Nuts!' We have also worked on our money and counting skills, whilst learning the importance of brushing our teeth and washing our hands.

We have learned two new stories about a spider in a sandwich and Snow White and the seven couch potatoes! We have baked lots of interesting things, including Mac N Cheese and Pear Upside-Down Cake. In art lessons, we have made a papier Mache Solar System, and our very own classroom Sun.

We have been very busy on Pathfinders, going to Mansfield town centre, day services and Willow Tree Farm every week. We also went to The Archer pub which is run by Landmarks. We loved visiting and some of us even got to pull our very first pint!

We've been exploring Yoga and have had a lesson every week, which we really look forward to. We have learnt the Sun Salutation, in keeping with our school theme of Space.

To reward us for all our hard work and making our new teacher feel so welcome, we went to the National Space Centre in Leicester at the end of the half term. We learned some more amazing things about the different planets in our Solar System in the Planetarium, which felt like we were moving through space! We saw a Space Rocket and went in the lift right to the top of it. We presented the weather and tried our hand at the Baked Bean Challenge. We played with a Mars Rover and saw an astronaut too. We had such a great time and loved every minute of our trip.



YPA—News from Upper 4!

Our topic this term is SPACE. So my class have been looking at all the planets in our solar system as well as making each planet through different art techniques: weaving, bubble wrap printing, collage, Paper Mache balloon, sun/dream catchers with glue, paint and glitter, three different techniques in mono printing, spray bottle printing and water colours/ wax crayons.

We have also been creating our own stories with 'The Dinosaur that pooped a planet' as inspiration and writing about what their alien characters look like.

We have also looked at different rockets, made our own rocket and what animals have gone to space.

They have made astronaut pudding, planet Jupiter pizza, space rock cakes and alien juice in Food Technology.
