Recycling Ollerton and Boughton (ROB)

Providing work-based training placements for adults with learning difficulties they have over 35 service users accessing the service, all of whom have very different abilities and needs. Support they give each individual is tailored accordingly, with the aim of giving them as productive and rewarding a day as is possible. Access to the service is generally made through Notts County Council's Community Learning Disability Teams or their Transitions Team. The recycling activities R.O.B offer although industrious, are labour intensive by design. Each team, operating on the kerbside and the business collections would generally comprise 2 or 3 members of staff and 3 or 4 service users.

The Adventure Service

The Adventure Service presently operates two day services in Nottinghamshire. The Day Service is a targeted personal development service for teenagers and adults with learning disabilities and additional support needs. They provide specialist outdoor activities for groups of adventurers to take part in. These activities include mountain biking, rock climbing, abseiling, weaselling, bushcraft, canoeing, hill walking, archery and much more. Adventurers all work towards individual skills targets and through expert instruction and support, the skills that individuals develop during the sessions are transferable into other areas of their lives. Group volunteering will help to develop an understanding of working with others and communication skills. The Adventure Service believes that learning outside the classroom, whether on the hills, in woodland or on the school field or playground, provides an exciting and stimulating change for learners, as well as reducing behavioural problems, triggering, inspiring and improving motivation as well as increasing a sense of wellbeing. Sam's Workplace

Sam's Workplace offers a realistic work experience placement for people with a learning disability, developing their independence and social skills. They run a small cafe and sweet shop, so there are plenty of opportunities for daily life and work skills, money skills, weighing and measuring, catering, customer care and social interaction in a supported and friendly environment. They are based within the local community of Rainworth and have allotments based in Blidworth offering a seed to table project growing fruit and vegetables, together with horticulture skills projects and some small animal care with chickens, rabbits and guinea pigs. There is also an enterprise workshop making arts and crafts goods for sale within the shop and at local community fairs. They have an independent bedroom, bathroom and kitchen training area so users can learn home making skills such as hoovering, bed making, dusting, cleaning which can be replicated at home.

Autism east midlands provide a wide range of care, support and education services. They aim to help develop existing and new skills by creating a structured timetable within a supportive environment. They also focus on developing communication skills, social integration, confidence and independence skills. They have 4 flexible day service centres, Dukeries (Worksop), Mundy (Heanor), Sherwood centre (Mansfield woodhouse) and Hamilton (Nottingham). Activities include creative sessions and arts and crafts, life skills such as cookery and gardening and community-based activities such as local walks and accessing public transport, bowling or swimming., local visits, ICT/computer skills, support with literacy and numeracy, promoting teamwork and team skills, building confidence, support into paid employment, voluntary positions in the community.
